

In Exodus chapter 3 how did God attract Moses' attention?

What about the place where Moses stood made it "a holy place"?

How did God introduce Himself?

What did God want Moses to do, and why?

How did Moses respond?

Exodus 12:3-10 describes God's instructions to His people about a special event which was to be commemorated by them each year. Describe what happens to the lamb.

What did the Israelites do after Moses and Aaron gave them God's instructions?

Pharaoh summoned Moses and Aaron in the middle of the night. What did Pharaoh tell them to do?

Are the Israelites leaving Egypt as refugee slaves, or as victorious conquerors?

In 19:5-6 God calls the people of Israel to commit themselves to a covenant (agreement) with Him. What were the terms of that agreement?

How did the people respond?

Considering that the ten commandments and other details of the law were (apparently) given **after** this incident, did the people "buy a pig in a poke"? Was their decision well-informed? Was it sincere?

Describe the preparations the people were required to make before their encounter with the Holy One of Israel.

What is the role of Moses in this chapter (what function does he serve)?
