In Genesis 3:4-5 the serpent makes an argument to persuade Eve to eat the forbidden fruit. Does the argument make sense?

In Genesis 3:11-13 who gets blamed for this tragedy?

In Genesis 3:13 does God give Adam "a pass" by accepting his explanation (excuse!) as being valid?

What significance might there be in the fact that God made clothes for Adam and Eve? (Genesis 3:21)

What are the terms of the agreement (or covenant, or contract) outlined in Genesis 12:1-3? Who are the parties to the agreement? What must each of them do?

How is the agreement modified in verse 7? What change is made? By whom?

What did Abram do in verse 7 and again in verse 8 that was not part of the agreement?

Does verse 10 indicate that God has failed to perform His part of the agreement?

What was the penalty for Abram's deception in verses 10-20? Is it fair?

In Genesis 22 we are not told how old Isaac is; we know that his father, Abraham, is more than 100 years old. From the information given in this chapter, estimate how old Isaac was at the time of this event.

What authority is invoked in verse 22:16 as assurance or guarantee of the new promise?

What modification (if any) is made to the agreement between Abraham and God in Genesis 22:17-18?

What happened to Isaac after Abraham found the ram? (Compare 22:5 to 22:19)
