Isaiah chapter 1

Who is the message from, who is it addressed to, what is it about, and who is the messenger? [1-2]

What complaint(s) is made against the children? [2-5] Who is God talking to and about from verse 5 forward?

Verses 11-15 suggest that the people of Judah were diligently obeying God's commands. What were His complaints against them? [16-17 and 21-29]

Isaiah chapter 6

Isaiah was ushered into the very presence of God in His throne room (presumably in a vision). [1-4] What do we learn about God from this passage? What was Isaiah's reaction to this awe-inspiring event? [5]

Did Isaiah have any idea what assignment God had in mind when He said "who will go?" What happened to Isaiah before he was given his assignment?

Go and deliver them my message until they can't hear it or see it anymore. Did God send Isaiah on a fool's errand? [7-9]

Isaiah chapter 58

What complaint did His people make to God? What was His complaint about them? [2-5]

The people fasted on the fast days, and feasted on feast days, brought all the appropriate sacrifices, and prayed three times a day – all as the law required. Why did God not respond to them; what did He *really* want? [5-7, 10, 13]

You can't truly love God without actively caring for the needs of your neighbor!
