Job Chapter 19

This chapter is Job's response to his three friends who have tried to comfort him. What is his complaint against them? Who does he blame for all his troubles? [6]

In verses 7-20 Job provides a catalog of his complaints. Why? Who is he trying to convince?

Has Job given up in despair? [25-27]

Job Chapter 31

What is Job's understanding of the rules of life [2-3]? What is his plea in [4-6]?

In chapter 19 Job listed his complaints, here his virtues; in verse 35 he asks God to present His indictment against Job, in a manner similar to the indictment Job lays against God. Who is the accuser? Does Job know this? Has he presented his case to the proper authority?

Job Chapter 40:1-14

Summarize God's response to Job's complaints. Does He provide the answers Job is demanding?

Job Chapter 42

Summarize Job's reaction to God's reply. [1-6]

Who was God angry with, and why? [7] How did God resolve the tensions between Job and his friends? [8-9] What role did Job play in that process?

Job sought justice from God; one aspect of justice is restoration, the attempt to "make whole" that which was lost. Did Job receive justice?
