

## **Joshua 6:15 – 7:15**

Verse 17 says “The city and all that is in it are to be devoted to the LORD.” What process was followed (what did the Israelites **do**) to dedicate or devote the city’s contents to God?

Who and/or what was exempt from this process? Why?

What promise was made to the one who would rebuild the city?

Verse 1 says “So the LORD’s anger burned against Israel.” Why was God angry with them? What was the consequence?

What did Joshua and the leaders of Israel do in response? Then what did God tell them to do?

## **Joshua Chapter 11**

What challenge did the Israelites face? How long did it take to overcome it?

What were the key factors of their success?

Verse 20 says “it was the LORD himself who hardened their hearts to wage war against Israel”. Why would God do this?

What was the final result recorded right at the end of chapter 11?

## **Joshua Chapter 24**

In the first 13 verses God gives the Israelites a history lesson. Why? What point was He trying make?

What was Joshua’s challenge to the people? What was their response? How many times did they repeat it?

Describe the process of creating this covenant between God and His people.
