This psalm is a prayer to God; the first two verses are obviously praise and adoration, but how would you characterize the remaining 15 verses? What petitions are made to God in verses 12-17?

Was this psalm intended for public group worship, or is it more suitable for private devotional use?

What promise(s) does the author of this psalm make to God? [3-6] What does he ask God to do? [7-9] Is this psalm appropriate for public or private worship?

Who is the writer of this psalm talking to? [1,20,21,22] Who is he talking about?

The author praises God; what petition(s) does he make of God? What would be appropriate uses for this psalm?

Psalm 100

There are eight commands given in this short psalm; what are they all about? Who are they addressed to?

Where do the actions of this psalm take place? Is this psalm appropriate for public or private worship?

This psalm sounds like party time! What portion of our worship should be quiet, reserved, somber, reflective, or reverential?
